# Educational Access Center

The **Educational Access Center** was created to establish a campus environment that is accessible to students with disabilities. We offer a wide range of services and assistance to meet the needs of students who have a permanent or temporary physical, mental, learning or sensory disability. North welcomes students with disabilities and provides services to help them attain their goals.

The **Educational Access Center (EAC)** provides services to students with documented disabilities that qualify them for academic accommodations under the law.

## How to Receive Services

- ✓ **Make an appointment** at the Student Success and Retention Services window with Suzanne Sewell.
- ✓ **Pick up an intake disk** from the EAC support window. Complete all forms on the disk and return it 48 hours prior to your intake appointment.
- ✓ **Submit documentation.** This is a typed, signed letter from a licensed professional qualified to diagnose and make recommendations for accommodations.

**The EAC retains the right to require further documentation if it is needed.**



## Services Provided

Academic accommodations are available and provided on an individual basis based upon the nature of your disability. The following are some of the services and accommodations the EAC may provide.

### ✓ **Pre-Admission inquiries:**

We will introduce you to our services and answer your questions over the phone, in person or by e-mail.

### ✓ **Intake Interview and Assessment:**

We will meet with you to determine your eligibility for services through the EAC.

### ✓ **Screening and diagnostic testing:**

If you feel that you have learning or attention difficulties, you can be interviewed and screened by the EAC free of charge. At that time we can also provide you with a referral for comprehensive and diagnostic testing elsewhere. You are responsible for all testing costs after the initial screening done by the EAC.

### ✓ **Consultation:**

The EAC staff will advise students, faculty, and staff on disability laws and issues.

### ✓ **Resource and Referral:**

The EAC has an extensive list of campus and community resources available for students with disabilities and other interested individuals. We make referrals as necessary.

The EAC provides auxiliary aids and services that include but are not limited to:
